Carlo, smile of heaven for this wounded and peaceless world, we praise God for your simple, joyful and holy life.


You accepted with trust

- **Family**: His parents weren't practicing Catholics, but Carlo found his own deep love for Jesus

- Faith Practices: Daily Mass, frequent Rosary, Adoration
- Famous Saying: "The Eucharist is my highway to Heaven."
- **Special Talents**: He taught himself coding and website design

- **Service**: Defended bullied classmates, helped the poor, volunteered as a catechist
- Illness & Death: Diagnosed with leukemia at age 15; died a week later on October 12, 2006

- Canonized: September 7, 2025



WHAT IS EUCHARISTIC ADORATION?

'Eucharistic Adoration' or the 'Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament' is a special type of prayer that happens outside of a celebration of Mass.

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament refers to the ritual when a consecrated host is taken from the tabernacle and is placed in a sacred object called a **Monstrance** so that the Eucharist can be displayed and seen by the congregation.

It is called the "**Exposition** of the Blessed Sacrament" because the Eucharist is **'exposed'** for all to see.

This type of prayer is called "adoration" because we are adoring Jesus' real presence.



BEFORE EUCHARISTIC ADORATION

Let us prepare for a time of prayer...

Before we enter the chapel, let us spend a moment in silence to prepare our hearts and minds for this encounter with Jesus, as we get ready to adore his awesome presence.


The word Eucharist means "to give thanks".

The Eucharist is an act of thanksgiving to God The Catechism of the Catholic Church (1329)

There is a space for you to write a prayer intention below...




Pause and Ponder


